New curriculum launch

As you can imagine, the Coronavirus has delayed the launch of Mayfield's new curriculum until further notice. It is our hope that the new curriculum will start within the first week that school fully reopens.

What work will the children be doing during the Coronavirus 'closure' ?

Schools have been asked to provide childcare, not education. With this advice in mind, webpage learning consolidates current knowledge, but will not build on existing learning and remains consistent with the 'reduced provision' for children attending school.

It is important to realise that both sets of children (the children at home and the children in school) need access to the same learning. With this in mind the provision will be as below:

	Morning Provision	Afternoon Provision
Children in school	Access to class webpage learning.	Physical Education in an appropriate environment.
Children at home	Access to class webpage learning.	

How do I access the work if my child is at home?

To access class webpage learning go to the school website: www.mayfield12.lancsngfl.ac.uk/

The page below should be visible. Click on the **class pages** and then the relevant classes.

Work will appear on these pages from Tuesday 24th March and the class pages will 'go live' at this point. This will allow for additional teacher preparation on this coming Monday.

Where does my child complete the work?

All children within school will have access to a book which work will be completed in. Children who are not attending school received a book and pencil to allow them to complete work in should they wish to use them. These were distributed on Friday 20th March. It is not essential to use this exercise book, we have simply offered it if you have nothing appropriate at home to record the children's work in.

What will the home learning consist of?

All class webpage learning will consist of maths and English work, which consolidates current or previous teaching. These elements of the home learning will be updated daily (not weekends). Alongside this, there will be a pre-learning task for the new curriculum topic. This will also be updated regularly, but not daily. Children in school will complete the same work as children at home.

Activities will not be updated during what was designated to be the Easter Holidays.

Due to the nature of the provision, we will not be able to mark and provide feedback at this stage. We also like to 'live' mark at school – this is our policy – and therefore distance marking would be of limited value anyway.

We differentiate work according to pupil starting points based upon the previous day/activities work. As this is not possible, we have decided to set a core standard of work which all children can access to different degrees. This is the best compromise we can offer under the current situation.

We will use our social media and internet platforms as ways of keeping contact and sending encouraging and thought provoking messages.
